Jim McEwan's Tasting Notes

Bruichladdich Full Strength – 2nd Edition

Colour Brightly hued Gold.

Body Powerful and pure, expansive without being explosive. The extra strength making the spirit glow with warmth & intensity.

Nose Opens beautifully with a little water to reveal the crisp sweetness of the malt coated with syrup/brown sugar with touches of vanilla & caramel. Then the twist of Madeira oak kicks in bringing beguiling notes of plummy fruit, prune & ripe banana. This is followed by the glazed citrus fruits for which Bruichladdich is famous. The oak is cruising along very relaxed and happy in the support role. It's a virile spirit offering a surprising level of character for its years.

Palate The magical flavours of traditionally made malt whisky race over the palate seeking out every taste receptor. This is high octave without the peat. Just shed loads of barley, candied fruits, almond nougat, chocolate mint, rich Madeira berries and spice, clover honey, ripe damson & plum and lemon & honey sorbet. It's an exceptionally exhilarating malt that wants to perform and believe me, it delivers.

Finish The moderate heat gives a malty extended aftertaste which ends on the freshness of the West Coast absolutely pure & completely satisfying.
